- Two cruise terminals Julia Street and Erato Street – with ample, secure parking available.
- Carnival and Norwegian sail weekly to destinations in the Eastern and Western Caribbean and Bahamas, and Royal Caribbean International returns in January 2020 with year round weekly sailings. Disney Cruise Line sails six cruises in 2020 from New Orleans.
