







#### ITEM E

Consider Approval of a Resolution Authorizing the President and Chief Executive Officer to Amend the Board's Lease with the Kearney Companies, Inc., for the France Road Terminal Berth 1 Marshaling Yard and Consolidation Shed to Add Two Acres to the Lease Site and to Extend the Term for an Additional Ten Years with Two Additional Five-Year Option Periods. (Mr. Bonura)

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

**DOCUMENTS**: Amendment to the Lease Agreement

PARTIES: The Kearney Companies, Inc. (Kearney or Lessee) and the Board

LOCATION: France Road Terminal, Berth 1- marshalling area and consolidation shed

**PREMISES:** 30.7 acres of land and a 66,000 square foot transit shed located at 2701 France Road, New Orleans, Louisiana. This is an increase of approximately two acres from the existing leased premises of 28.7 acres.

**TERM:** The term would be extended ten years (hereafter "Extended Term") followed by two extended option terms, each five years long (hereafter "Extended Option Term 1" and "Extended Option Term 2" respectively).

#### **RENT:**

**Extended Term Yrs. 1-3:** \$350,000 annually (\$29,166.67 monthly) **Extended Term Yrs. 4-5:** \$385,000 annually (\$32,083.33 monthly) **Extended Option Term 1:** \$450,000 annually (\$37,500 monthly) **Extended Option Term 2:** \$500,000 annually (\$41,666.67 monthly)

**USE:** Lessee's current limitation of use, which states Lessee shall engage in the storing, handling, sorting and shipping of international and domestic cargoes, and other operations associated therewith, shall not change.

**BACKGROUND:** Lessee has secured a new line of business to transload organic animal feed from barge to rail. Barge shipments will be handled at the unleased berth next to Kearney's lease site. The animal feed will be transferred into a new storage structure located in the two acres being added to the site. From the new storage structure, it will be transloaded into rail cars. Kearney is not leasing the berth, and it will still be available to other parties by filing a berth application.

**RAIL IMPROVEMENTS:** Lessee shall install two 500-foot long rail tracks at its cost. If Lessee does not install rail, rent increases by \$25,000.

**BULK CARGO RATES:** Bulk cargo handled at France Road Terminal Berth 1 for Lessee's customers and the associated dockage and security fees will be charged at the same rate for the transfer of bulk cargo on the Industrial Canal. Every five years, if the Board has increased those tariff charges, the cargo-handling rates will be adjusted to equal the lower of the then-current rates or the original rates adjusted by CPI-U. These bulk cargo charges represent revenue that is in addition to the fixed rental rates referenced above.

#### ITEM E

#### **RESOLUTION**

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF NEW ORLEANS that its President and Chief Executive Officer Brandy D. Christian be, and she is, hereby authorized and empowered on behalf of this Board to amend the Board's lease with

the Kearney Companies, Inc., for the France Road Terminal Berth 1 Marshaling Yard and Consolidation Shed to add two acres to the lease site and to extend the term for an additional ten years with two additional five-year option periods on such terms and conditions as the said Brandy D. Christian may in her discretion determine to be in the best interests of this Board and not inconsistent with the foregoing; and

**IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED BY THIS BOARD** that the said Brandy D. Christian be, and she is, hereby authorized to take such actions, enter into such agreements and execute such documents as are deemed necessary in her discretion to give full force and effect to the intentions expressed in this resolution.

#### ITEM F

Consider Approval of a Resolution Nominating Christian D. Bonura, Janine M. Mansour, and Karley D. Frankic to Serve as a Commissioner of the Board of Commissioners of the New Orleans Regional Business Park (Mr. Bonura)

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Board of Commissioners of the New Orleans Regional Business Park (NORBP, formerly the Almonaster-Michoud Industrial District and the New Orleans Business and Industrial District) was formed to promote business development in an industrial area that includes Michoud and some of the Port's properties near Jourdan Road and Terminal Road. The NORBP is a taxing district with the ability to collect a supplemental property tax on businesses for improvement and maintenance projects, although it no longer levies a tax. It also owns the Enterprise Center at 13801 Old Gentilly Road, which it leases.

One of the seats on the NORBP is filled by a person nominated by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans. The law requires this Board to send the names of three nominees to the Mayor of the City of New Orleans, and the Mayor must appoint one of the three.

Mr. Bonura has served on the NORBP as this Board's nominee for the last two years, and his term expires on May 22. He is this Board's Director of Real Estate, and he has been employed with the Board since August, 2004.

Ms. Mansour is this Board's Director of Marketing, and she has been employed with the Board since July, 2010.

Ms. Frankic is a Port Planner with this Board, and she has been employed with the Board since December. 2014.
